- Seek out and obtain audio and/or visual elements for programming and production. If necessary, negotiates, within established parameters, the acquisition of audio and/or visual material from internal or external suppliers.
- Develop and maintain subject files.
- As required, provide general administrative support to the program unit.
- As required, perform the following tasks:
 - synthesize and present in writing the results of research activity;
 - write and prepare basic scripts or articles;
 - input articles and videos into CBC content management systems
 - arrange for guests, commentators, panelists, etc., conduct pre- interviews, evaluate analyze and prepare relevant information.
 - assist in seeding out CBC Arts content to various community organizations and groups.
